## *Fishing with the Preacher . . .*

Those interested in fishing may find helpful this monthly contribution by Bro. Jackie Miller, Minister of Clewiston First Christian Church. If you would like to speak with Bro. Jackie personally about the fishing opportunities in the area please see Dora in the Office. She can give you the contact information for her Dad.

My son STEVE came down for a few days after Christmas. We fished down at the Sawgrass Area and brought back 41, mostly Warmouth & Blue Gill, all caught on jigs. We caught twice that many but we had to cull them. We had to fish deep and slow. On New Year's Eve we fished a couple of hours in the Rim Canal and caught 5 Bass and 1 Blue Gill on beetle-spins. The next day STEVE and I went down to L-1 and brought back 27, our limit of Bass, several Spec and some Blue Gill, caught on jigs & beetle-spins. JACK PHILLIPS brought back 26 caught on crickets. All told we got 2.5 gallons of filets for our Fish Fry! My brother BOBBY joined me at the Moore Haven Ramp and we fished the Rim Canal towards Old Sportsman's Village and caught over 30 on jigs & beetle-spins. We kept only 10 – 6 Specs, 2 Shell Crackers and 2 Warmouth. ROGER OSBORNE said he and his son KIRK caught around 75 Bass on Rattle-Traps and other artificial baits. JACK PHILLIPS & I made a trip down to L-1 canal after the rain on the 7th and brought back 25 – 21 Specs, 2 Bass and 2 Blue Gill caught mostly on jigs. That afternoon ROGER OSBORNE called and said he and his son KIRK were just leaving the Sawgrass area with 10 nice bass about 15". On the 11th, ROGER OSBORNE and I fished in the Rim Canal and Uncle Joe's cut and brought back 16 – 2 Specs and 14 Bream. We caught over 20 nice Bass and a few more Spec and Blue Gill caught on jigs & beetle spins. JERRY & SHERRY WIMMER brought back 13 Specs on one trip, caught on minnows. BUD LOUDNER & EDNA SMITH have been catching their limit of Big Specs. Bud said one was 16+ inches and he had to break his pole trying to land them. I took JACK PHILLIPS down the rim canal and we fished there and the football field. We caught 5 Specs, 4 were large and keepers, and 1 Blue Gill and several nice bass up to 17+". I got a full quart of filets out of the 5 we kept. The most recent catches of Specs are: NOEL & NAMOI HUMFLEET – 22; JOE & MARYANN PAYNE – 22; BUD LOUDNER & EDNA SMITH – 37; DAVE & BRITTEE EDGE – 27; I went with NOAL UMFLEET out to Bird Island. WE caught over 30, but kept 20 – 2 Catfish, 2 Blue Gill and 16 Specs. We caught them on minnows in 2.5' of water.
