WATERCOLOR CLASS UPDATE

First of all, we were able to reduce the fee due to the large number of people who have signed up. The fee is now \$20 for one week of classes which would be Tues and Thurs plus a weekly supply fee of \$5. The supply fee is for the use of brushes and paint and palette. That means that the total amount per week is \$25. unless someone has their own paint and brushes. Then the fee is only \$20. per week.

Each painting will be started on Tuesday and completed on Thursday, so if someone is only here for one week, they will be able to do a painting while they are staying. It is not necessary to sign up for all of the classes. If there is someone who only wants to take one or two week's classes, that's OK. This class is designed for the beginner who has never painted but has always want to try it. This week's painting is a Zebra and next week we will do Two Herons.

The morning class is full but there is room for several people in the afternoon class which is from 1 pm to 3 pm Tuesday and Thursday. There are a few supplies that each person needs to bring but probably have on hand....pencil, eraser, pad of paper to take notes, cheap metal nail file or pointed knife, new soft tooth brush(cheap), old towel(in case of spills), large water container(4 cups), tissues without lotion, paper towels. That's it!
