one occasion been **LYING** in bed late at night trying to think of ways to better the park for the guest and the owner.

It has also been witnessed by many that both Artie and Dora have **CHEATED** themselves from quality personal and family time in order to attend to the needs of the park and its quests. And in the complaint of stealing we will personally attest to the fact that both Artie and Dora have been stealing the hearts of the guests that stay at the Glades.

The next seven complaints are being stated against The Glades and it's employees. The park has caused **EMOTIONAL STRESS** for many who have been here including but not limited to feelings of **JEALOUSY, ENVY, FRUSTRATION, EMBARRASMENT, SHAMEFULNESS, ANGER AND SADNESS**. Many visitors from neighboring parks have left here feeling **JEALOUS** and **ENVIUS** after experiencing an evening of The Glades hospitality and fun times.

The feeling of **FRUSTRATION** and **EMBARRASMENT** has been experienced by other park managers who can not match the high standards of The Glades' management.

It is truly **SHAMEFUL** that everyone does not take advantage of the opportunity to enjoy Sunday services with the witty and spiritual-filled sermons delivered by Artie and the angelic voice of Dora when she sings.

Many snowbirds have expressed feelings of **ANGER**. They have become **ANGRY** with themselves after realizing they had spent so many years up north in the cold when they could have been in paradise. And, The Glades is responsible for a deep feeling of **SADNESS** due to the fact that many of us will be **SAD** when it is time to leave and we will greatly miss the friends and time we have spent at The Glades.

The last complaint is that The Glades is **HAZARDOUS TO YOUR HEALTH**. Many people have arrived here with great expectations of losing unwanted weight and becoming healthy and after several months of ice cream socials, Tuesday night meals, Artie's biscuits and gravy and waffle bar on Sunday mornings, many of us will leave here 5-10 pounds heavier and our cholesterol number will be higher. Even those who have bypassed the temptations of the fried chicken, the Mexican nights, the beans and cornbread meals, the cook outs, along with Sunday's breakfast bars their health is still at risk. After numerous hours of golf, endless days of swimming in the pool, poker nights and bingo, along with the exciting games of bean bag baseball, shuffleboard and too many other activities to list, our **HEALTH IS AT GREAT RISK** because everyone knows the old saying: **TOO MUCH OF A GOOD THING CAN KILL YOU!**

I hope that The Glades will take these complaints serious and we recommend that the parties responsible be held accountable, (which we believe the responsible parties are Artie & Dora), that they will take some time off for some well deserved R&R during the summer months. And that they will accept their fate and their punishment, that they must remain here at The Glades for many years tolerating our annual winter visits because **We aren't going anywhere else . . . you are stuck with us all.**

Fishing with the Preacher . . .

Those interested in fishing may find helpful this monthly contribution by Bro. Jackie Miller, Minister of Clewiston First Christian Church. If you would like to speak with Bro. Jackie personally about the fishing opportunities in the area please see Dora in the Office. She can give you the contact information for her Dad.

I took BOBBY ELSWICK in my boat and JOHN POWELL took BOBBY MILLER in his boat and we went out to Bird Island. It was a beautiful day but we didn't find the Specs. I caught one and my brother Bobby caught one. Bobby Elswick caught a catfish and some bass and a blue gill and I also caught some bass and blue gill. As we were loading our boats a man told me he had caught several nice Specs at Indian Prairie. Later JACK PHILLIPS & I made a trip over there. We caught only 2 Specs and 9 blue gills that we kept, plus several bass that we threw back. It seems that as far as Specs are concerned, I'm always a day late. MARK HILL, a new camper at The Glades, called and asked me to take him fishing. I took him down the canal and we fished the first dynamite hole and the football field. We caught 35-40! We brought back 21, 11 Specs and 10 BIG blue gills. We threw back around a dozen nice Bass and 1 Spec. I went with NOEL UMFLEET out to Bird Island and we caught over 30 on jigs. We brought back 17 nice Specs, 3 blue gill and 1-20" Catfish. The wind finally blew us away. BRANDON McMILLAN of Belle Glade won the FLW Tournament with 108 pounds for his 20 Bass. That's an average of over 5 pounds! He won \$125,000.00! One man brought a catch one day of over 35 pounds, an over 7 pound average! NOEL UMFLEET reported that he and a friend caught several nice Bass on artificial lures up to 8 lb. 10 oz. They caught over 40, 3 pounders and up. JOHN POWELL told me that his neighbors DON & DUTCH DOORBAS (The Clowns) caught 17 nice Specs right off their dock, close to highway 78 at Lakeport, on minnows. WALTER & JANET GILBERT brought back 20 nice Specs, 10 catfish and 4 Warmouth caught at the end of Uncle Joe's Cut. BOBBY & MARVIN MILLER (of the Kentucky Hillbillies), caught several nice Catfish at the end of Indian Prairie Canal and several nice Specs in the Canal. After ANDREW BRINN returned from India, I took him on a fishing trip. We fished the rim canal at Moore Haven. We caught over 30 but brought back 17; 7 Spec, 9 Blue Gill and 1 Catfish. WALTER & JANET GILBERT brought back 29 Big Specs they caught at the end of Uncle Joe's Cut. JOE PAYNE had several good days with clients. One day he said they caught around 75 Bass! ROGER & TOM OSBORNE have been catching a lot of Bass also. JACK PHILLIPS & I went down to Alligator Alley for a fishing trip. We brought back a 5 gallon bucket full - 10 Specs, 4 nice Bass and 76 Blue gill, shell crackers & pumpkin seeds. We threw several back. We caught them mostly on jigs and beetle-spins. JOE PAYNE took a client out blue gilling, using crickets and brought back 40! JACK PHILLIPS & I brought back 14 blue gills from Bird Island caught on beetle spins. The lake is at 12.30'
